

Dedication Of Markers Set

The Chesterfield County Independence Bicentennial Committee will dedicate two roadside historical markers for two 18th century houses beginning at 1 p.m. Oct. 11.

The first marker will point out Trabue's Tavern, located on Old Buckingham Road in Midlothian. The tavern, which will be open to visitors after the ceremony, was the home of Lt. John Trabue, a Revolutionary War soldier.

The second marker, to be dedicated at 3:45, will commemorate Eppington House on State Rt. 602 near Winterpock. The house was built in the late 1760s by Francis Eppes, who married the half-sister of Martha Jefferson. The house frequently was visited by Thomas Jefferson. His daughter, Lucy, is believed to be buried near there.
